
Dog of Honour: A Modern Guide to Weddings with Your Pup

HAVE SOMEONE ON DOG DUTY

- Schedule breaks for walks and playtime to keep your dog calm.
- Check if the venue provides water and feeding
- Bring your dog's food, treats, and comforts if needed.

MAKING IT ALL HAPPEN

- Decide if your dog will join for the ceremony, reception, or whole day.
- Plan who will handle pick-up and drop-off.
- · Make sure your dog has what they need.
- Share the schedule with everyone involved.

PICK THE PERFECT OUTFIT

- A dog in a wedding veil or suit adds extra charm to your big day.
- Many companies offer bow ties, veils, and floral crowns for pets.
- Consider the weather—summer heat can make outfits uncomfortable.
- Some pet outfits may be impractical or uncomfortable to wear all day.
